How do we collect your data?

Parishes

When we approach parishes to see if they would be interested in receiving our weekly email, we locate their addresses from the public domain (usually via diocesan websites). In sending this unsolicited email, we meet the GDPR requirements that:

- There is 'legitimate interest' behind the email.
- The recipient must opt-in in order to receive further emails.
- In the absence of opt-in, no further emails are sent.

Individuals

We only collect your data when you give it to us directly, by subscribing to our weekly email via our Contact Us page.

What data do we collect?

Your name and email address only.

Why do we collect your data?

We use your data to provide you with the weekly email which you requested from us.

Do we share your data?

We do not share your data with any third parties.

How do we store your data?

We store your data on our computer located in Dublin.

For how long do we keep your data?

There is an 'unsubscribe' option at the foot of every email we send to you. If you choose to unsubscribe, we delete your name and email address permanently.

What about cookies?

We use three kinds of cookies.

First, there are cookies **necessary for the normal website functions**. These cookies cannot be switched off because the website wouldn't work properly anymore. However, these identifiers do not store any personal data.

Secondly, there are **cookies used for analytics**. These cookies allow us to count visits and visitor sources, so we can measure and improve the performance of our site. They help us know which pages are the most and least popular and see how visitors move around the site. These cookies do not collect any private or personally identifiable information. You can reject them by changing your cookie settings on your browser or by downloading and installing the Google Analytics Opt-out Browser Add-on available here <https://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout>.

Thirdly, there are **functional cookies**. When we use YouTube to show videos on our website, it has its own identifier. Without it, the videos are unlikely to work. However, you have the option to reject it by changing the cookie settings on your browser.

We do not use marketing or advertising cookies.
