How do we collect your data?

Parishes

When we approach parishes to see if they would be interested in receiving our weekly email, we locate their addresses from the public domain (usually via diocesan websites). The recipient of the email must opt in in order to receive further emails. In the absence of opt-in, no further emails are sent to that email address.

Individuals

We only collect your data when you give it to us directly, by subscribing to our weekly email via our Contact Us page.

What data do we collect?

Your name and email address only.

Why do we collect your data?

We use your data to provide you with the weekly email which you requested from us.

Do we share your data?

We will never share your data with any third parties.

How do we store your data?

We store your data on our computer located in Dublin, Ireland.

For how long do we keep your data?

There is an 'unsubscribe' option at the foot of every email we send to you. If you choose to unsubscribe, we delete your name and email address permanently.

What are cookies?

A cookie is a small text file that a website saves on your computer or mobile device when you visit the site. It enables the website to remember your actions and preferences (such as login, language, font size and other display preferences) over a period of time, so you don't have to keep re-entering them whenever you come back to the site or browse from one page to another.

What cookies do we use?

We use three kinds of cookies.

First, there are cookies **necessary for the normal website functions**. These cookies cannot be switched off because the website wouldn't work properly anymore. However, these identifiers do not store any personal data.

Secondly, there are **cookies used for analytics**. These cookies allow us to count visits and visitor sources, so we can measure and improve the performance of our site. They help us know which pages are the most and least popular and see how visitors move around the site. These cookies do not collect any private or personally identifiable information. You can reject them by changing your cookie settings on your browser or by downloading and installing the Google Analytics Opt-out Browser Add-on available here <https://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout>.

Embedded video content cookies: We use Google's YouTube application to store and show video content on our website. Cookies are set by YouTube to track usage of its services. The YouTube cookies are only installed when you press play. YouTube does not have an independent cookie policy, but refers to the [Privacy Policy](#) of its mother company, Google.
